FROM SAUTÉ **TO SERVSAFE** A Year in the Kitchen

In just one year, our Culinary Arts Classroom-Based Training Program has cooked up a batch of success stories. Since its launch in February, the program has produced three cohorts of skilled food service professionals. Fourteen participants have earned their white chef coats, and 100% of those who tested for ServSafe certification-a key credential for success in the food industry-successfully achieved it.

This year's cohorts dove into culinary essentials. mastering knife skills, recipe execution, and customer service. The crowning achievement? Two pop-up restaurant events, where participants wowed quests with their teamwork and delicious dishes-offering a real-world taste of working in a professional kitchen.

The program's impact is already evident. One graduate secured a position as General Assistance Manager at Wawa, while others are actively pursuing food service careers with new confidence and marketable skills.

"This program is about building careers, creating opportunities, and helping individuals grow," says Kaylee Wickersham, Manager of Culinary Arts. "Seeing our participants support each other and develop into skilled professionals has been so rewarding."
